II. About Badili Africa

Badili Africa is a Pan-African women's rights organization based in Nairobi, Kenya. We cultivate and strengthen the leadership capacities of grassroots women and young women in the informal settlements and learning institutions by nurturing and supporting spaces that enable Chama women and young women to organize as leaders to influence local development plans, policies, and programs in ways that prioritize the needs of girls and women and those of their communities.

III. Background

At Badili Africa, we are pioneering a bold, feminist innovation that reimagines civic education by intentionally targeting young women who are often disengaged or excluded from political spaces. Through our signature and flagship Political Spas and Glam Sessions, we merge makeup artistry, personal grooming, and civic dialogue to create safe, affirming, and accessible entry points for young women to explore their political agency. These sessions, particularly popular among young women in tertiary institutions and informal settlements, use beauty culture as both an incentive and equalizer, transforming traditional civic education into a space that is enjoyable, impactful, and deeply relevant.

Over the past four years, these transformative sessions have drawn young women, many of whom would otherwise avoid political discourse, into engaging conversations on voter registration, reproductive rights, women's political representation, the cost of living, and community development. This approach affirms that beauty and political consciousness are not mutually exclusive, but powerful tools when brought together to expand democratic participation and feminist leadership.

Purpose of the Consultancy.

To design and develop a vibrant, intersectional, and feminist civic education toolkit that reflects the lived experiences, needs, and aspirations of young women, particularly those from marginalized communities, and supports their meaningful participation in civic and political life through platforms like the Political Spa sessions.

Objectives

- To create an accessible, youth-friendly, and creative toolkit that demystifies civic engagement for young women, using culturally resonant and gender-affirming approaches.
- To integrate key themes of gender justice, digital safety, feminist leadership, and rights-based civic education into the content.
- To equip facilitators of Political Spa sessions with interactive, practical tools that foster critical reflection, agency, and action among young women.

IV. Responsibilities

The consultant will work under the supervision of the program coordinator to do the following:

- Conduct consultations with young women, feminist organizers, and youth leaders to identify knowledge gaps and contextual needs in civic engagement.
- Design modular content covering topics such as:
 - > Democratic participation and political representation.
 - > Community organizing and public accountability
 - > Digital advocacy and safety
 - > Bodily autonomy and reproductive justice
 - > Intersectional feminist leadership
- Use relatable language, storytelling, visuals, and participatory learning methodologies throughout the toolkit.
- Ensure the toolkit is adaptable for both online and in-person delivery, especially within the Political Spa framework.
- Pilot the toolkit with a select group of young women and facilitators; gather feedback and revise accordingly.
